

Ridgeview At a Glance

Ridgeview Medical Center is an independent, nonprofit, regional health care system serving the southwest metro region of the Twin Cities and beyond. Its network includes three hospitals—located in Waconia, Arlington and Le Sueur—a multitude of primary and specialty care clinics, emergency services and specialty programs, a nursing home, independent living apartments and Two Twelve Medical Center in Chaska—a freestanding 24/7 emergency and urgent care facility with multispecialty clinics and services.

Ridgeview serves a population of more than 300,000 people, primarily from its service area of Carver, Sibley, southern Wright, western Hennepin, eastern McLeod, Le Sueur and Scott counties. Ridgeview is one of the largest employers in Carver County, with more than 2,000 employees and 400 volunteers supporting the organization.

The hospitals, associated clinics and physicians have a well-earned reputation for clinical excellence and extraordinary service. Patients say the Ridgeview experience is distinctly different from what they encounter at other health facilities.

2017 HIGHLIGHTS

- In Jan. 2017, Ridgeview acquired Minnesota Valley Health Center in Le Sueur, Minnesota, adding its second critical access hospital, as well as a nursing home and senior living apartments.
- Michael Phelps was appointed Ridgeview's new president and CEO in July 2017, replacing Robert Stevens. He is the third CEO in the organization's 54-year history, beginning with John Devins (1963-1996).
- The newly constructed Ridgeview Health Campus in Belle Plaine opened in June 2017—bringing Ridgeview's 12th primary care clinic location, KingsPath Senior Living, urgent care, rehab, specialty services and more to this new health care destination.
- Ridgeview began renovation of Ridgeview Sibley Medical Center in Sept. 2017. This \$7.5 million project will add more than 2,000 square feet, upgrading its Emergency and Urgent Care Departments.
- Urgent Care services continue to expand to new locations which now includes: Two Twelve Medical Center in Chaska, Ridgeview Delano Clinic, Ridgeview Belle Plaine Clinic, Ridgeview Sibley Medical Center in Arlington and Ridgeview Le Sueur Medical Center.
- Ridgeview eCare expanded to include online care and prescriptions for 17 common conditions. (www.ridgeviewecare.org)
- Ridgeview's medical staff grew to 650 credentialed providers representing 40 general and specialty areas.

GRATITUDE

A patient's life-saving story.

Despite a car accident that broke her neck and forced doctors to amputate her left arm, Jessie Krone is filled with gratitude. She's thankful for the skilled team of medical professionals who saved more than her life.

When first responders arrived at the scene of the accident, they found Jessie unresponsive, bleeding extensively and trapped in the wreckage. They worked diligently and within minutes, transported her to Ridgeview's Emergency Department in Waconia where a team of doctors were awaiting her arrival. While assessing the extent of Jessie's injury, doctors discovered something unexpected—Jessie was seven months pregnant. No one knew.

The Ridgeview team went from having one critical patient, to having two.

Within minutes there was a large team assisting—ER physicians, nurses, lab and x-ray technicians, general surgeons and orthopedic surgeons. Mollie was born by C-section seconds later and immediately handed over to the Ridgeview neonatal team. "Having the resources in place, we were able to get Mollie quickly stabilized and transported safely to Children's Hospital," said Ellen Bendel-Stenzel, MD, Minnesota Neonatal Physicians, PA.

In emergency medicine, there is a period of time commonly referred to as the "golden hour" of trauma, when there is the highest likelihood that prompt and extreme life-saving measures can truly save lives. Jessie and Molly's physicians agree that both fell within this category.

"Thank you isn't enough," Krone explained. "I could have had nothing—but now I have everything."
